Instruction «Swiss Tennis Bronze Badge Chair Umpire course»

Introduction	<p>Games at higher national and international tournaments are officiated by qualified chair umpires. The chair umpire ensures that matches are played in accordance with regulations. He will make all the decisions and knows the match regulations and behavioural rules in particular as well as the application of the code of conduct. Bronze badge chair umpires are chiefly deployed at national tournaments.</p>
Training pathway	<p>Module 1 Training course (theory + practice) always in October/November (for precise dates, see course schedule)</p> <p>Module 2 Practical tournament deployments (practice) always in February/March/April (precise dates will be notified after Module 1) You can gain experience through the practical tournament deployments and this will make you more confident in your future work as an umpire. You will be supported and assessed at all the tournaments. Two practical tournament deployments are compulsory!</p> <p>Module 3 Practical examination (Interclub central finals day, Burgdorf) always in June (for precise date, see course schedule)</p>
Authorisation	<p>Swiss Tennis will make a decision about authorisation on the basis of the application documentation.</p> <p>Condition</p> <p>Module 1</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Minimum age 16 years (age group) • Knowledge of the rules • Good vision and hearing <p>Module 2</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Module 1 completed successfully <p>Module 3</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Module 1 and 2 completed successfully • Selection/suitability through Swiss Tennis

Payment of the invoice gives the right to attend the course.</p>
Further training	<p>Obligation to undertake further training</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At least four practical deployments per year (one match in the chair corresponds to one deployment, one day as a stand-by chair umpire is assessed as one deployment) • Submit the data card at the end of the year (signed by all the referees) • Fill out the questionnaire or attend Chair Umpire Day (compulsory every two years) <p>Further training obligation not satisfied</p> <p>The chair umpire will be made «inactive».</p> <p>The chair umpire will become «active» again by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Filling out the questionnaire or attending Chair Umpire Day (compulsory every two years) • As well as completing at least one practical deployment and receiving one sufficient evaluation from the relevant referee
